What to think of when editing this part of the wiki

This section contains magazines and articles from magazines once released elsewhere as finished products, not originally intended for wikis. Therefore these kinds of articles need to be handled a little bit more carefully than other parts of the wiki. In short; any modifications to these texts should be added in footnotes rather than by modifying the original text.

Adding footnotes is done by inserting the text you want to add in double parenteses ((like this)) (and the result would be ¹⁾). No information should be removed or changed in the original articles and please state clearly who you are, in case you add a footnote.

In this way, the wiki can work both as a preserving tool and as a way to get to grips with inconsistencies in these texts, and at the same time making articles in C64 form accessible to google searches and so on.
